The current 30 foot tall lights already light up the entire valley and our view but we tolerate them as we try to be good neighbors.

The proposed 80 foot tall lights would be incredibly intrusive as we know that they will be on many nights, not just 11 or 12 for games as MC originally claimed. Their claim that the lights will only affect 40 houses is nonsensical. The light pollution will be much worse, not to mention the additional congestion and noise from Sir Francis Drake Blvd.
